49 MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 21st OCTOBER 2025

Council members were provided with a copy of the minutes.

RESOLVED: To approve the minutes as a true record of the meeting.

50 MONTHLY REPORT RECEIVED FROM THE SPORTS AND RECREATION OFFICER

Council members were provided with a copy of the report which included an overview of the anticipate week activities and the return of the youth club sessions. A request for funding to the sum of £150.00 was received to support a Christmas Inflatable Fun Session to be held in December.

RESOLVED: For the funding request to be approved.

51 COMMUNITY CLEAN UP CHAMPION

Members were provided with a newsletter which included details of how much litter had been collected in October, along with a summary of the litter collected from the firework event. The Clean up Champion advised that the litter in the pit top area, along with Briar Road and Beech Road is getting worse.

52 PROVISION OF PUBLIC BENCHES

Councillor T Needham advised that discussions are ongoing regarding the costs quoted by Doncaster Council.

53 REFURBISHMENT OF BURIAL GROUND PERGOLA

No updates.

54 TREE MAINTENANCE COW HOUSE LANE

Council members were provided with a quote to prune back trees along the boundary of Cow House Lane and the caravan park.

RESOLVED: To approve the quote received from Gloaming Tree Surgery at a cost of £960.00

55 PURCHASE OF SHREDDER

Council members were provided with a summary of quotes for the provision of a shredder. A discussion took place regarding the current fees for shredding.

RESOLVED: To continue with the use of a contractor for shredding.

56 ARMTHORPE COMMUNITY CENTRE MATTERS

a. Electrical Issues

Council members received a report from J P Glasby Ltd outlining the remedial works undertaken following unsafe practices identified during the removal of the container from the site.

RESOLVED: To write to 32nd Doncaster (Armthorpe) Scouts to request a reimbursement for the remedial works and not to allow any third-party contractors to carry out work on the site.

b. Defibrillator

The Clerk advised that City Councillor C Marriott had provided funding of £795.00 towards the purchase of a defibrillator. Council members were provided with the details of three units available within the budget.

RESOLVED: To purchase a defibrillator with paediatric pads.

c. Servicing of boilers

Council members were provided with a summary of companies contacted to provide a quote to service the water and heating boilers within the building. Council members noted that only one contractor had been able to provide a quote for the work.

RESOLVED: To appoint Yorkshire Mechanical Services Ltd at a cost of £439.57 plus VAT.

d. Access Audit Report

Council members were provided with two quotes to provide an Access Audit Report which would identify barriers for visitors with any impairments.

RESOLVED: To appoint About Access Ltd at a cost of £1,100.00 plus VAT.

e. Collection point for plastic bags

Council members were provided with a copy of a letter requesting permission to set up a plastic bag drop off point, once collected the bags are made into mats for homeless people.

RESOLVED: Not to approve the request due to a lack of space.

Report of the Sports and Recreation Officer to a meeting of the Council's Community Centre and General Purposes Committee, to be held on 20th January 2026

1. Introduction

The purpose of this report is to update Members of the Committee about (amongst other things) activities undertaken in the previous month since its last meeting.

2. Tag Rugby Festival

The Armthorpe Schools will participate in tag rugby festivals this month. Players have participated in practice sessions and trial games to prepare for this year's competitions. Young people are motivated by the more physical aspects of the game and will now compete against the very best tag rugby players of Armthorpe.

3. Christmas Market

APC provided its annual Christmas Market last November which was a success. As part of the event, nominated school children were invited from Armthorpe schools to turn on the community Christmas lights. Therefore, we introduced the children to the public, before turning the Christmas lights on in front of a crowd. The young people enjoyed the occasion that celebrates their individual success.

4. Armthorpe Youth Club

I am pleased with the response from young people who have been attending the Armthorpe Youth Club sessions. The programme is delivered on a Monday evening to 7-11 year olds on a Thursday evening to 12-16 year olds. The attending young people have enjoyed most aspects of the sessions, including social and sporting activities. The project will now develop further with access to the computer suite, giving young people a wide range of activities.



5. Christmas Inflatable Fun

During the Christmas School holidays, APC provided an inflatable fun party to celebrate the initial success of the new youth club programme. The participating youth club members enjoyed the party style activities which included inflatable fun, music, indoor sports and games with refreshments available for all attending children.




6. Advanced Fitness Class

The APC advanced fitness class has had a positive response from the Armthorpe residents. The project aim is to improve adults' overall mobility, fitness and strength through a more intense aerobic style of activity. The class offers Armthorpe adults an alternative session or a stepping stone from your traditional fitness circuit style class provided on a Friday morning.

7. Pickleball Club

I propose that Council members consider starting a pickleball club for Armthorpe adults at the Armthorpe Community Centre. Pickleball is the rapidly growing sport in the UK which up to four players can play by using a smooth-faced paddle to hit a plastic ball over a net and is hit back until one side is unable to return (Similar to tennis). The game is an easier version of tennis and offers older adults a low impact workout that burns calories, improves health and provides another way to socialise.



However, hall space is limited at the Armthorpe Community Centre which could mean that the project would replace another session, for example ping pong, table tennis or one of the fitness classes.

7.1 Sports and Recreation Meeting

Therefore, I propose to arrange a sports and recreation sub-committee meeting to review all the adult provision provided by APC. Council members would review what and why the current projects are provided, how we could improve any of the sessions and what potential projects could be offered in the future. Additionally, Members could consider a potential cost for adults to attend, as we currently provide all sessions free of charge. For example, we could offer a potential subscription package of £10 per month, giving them unlimited access to attend any of the sessions throughout the month - £20 per month per for adults that live outside the village.

COVERED






SHOUT OUT!

The Main Offenders


